Victory Congress in Vitória, Brazil

The Brazilian Society of Sexually Transmitted Diseases (SBDST) has held its congress biennially for over 25 years. A large number of results from studies and works were evaluated in a complete or abstract way. Under peer review, the most interesting papers were accepted for poster and oral presentations. These are available in this issue of the Brazilian Journal of Sexually Transmitted Diseases.

We now hope that these exceptional circumstances will pass, and that in-person events will be possible again so we can meet face to face and without fear in 2023, in the city of Florianópolis, for the XIV Brazilian Congress on Sexually Transmitted Diseases.
